

# ARMED SUSPECT GUILLERMO YBARRA ARRESTED BY SFPD

SAN FRANCISCO—On October 16, the San Francisco Police Department announced in a news release that a suspect who was armed was arrested by authorities. The SFPD reported on October 7, at approximately 7:31 a.m., officers were patrolling the area of Mission and Julia Streets when they observed a suspect committing vehicle code violations while on a bicycle.

Officers maintained a visual of the suspect and attempted to affect a traffic stop. Officers gave commands to the

suspect to stop and dismount the bicycle which the suspect ignored and fled from police. Officers were able to detain the suspect, who failed to comply to officers' demands and resisted arrest. During the investigation, officers later located a loaded firearm in the suspect's possession which was seized. It was determined that the firearm was stolen.

The suspect was transported to a local hospital where he was medically evaluated. Officers developed probable

cause to arrest Guillermo Ybarra, 29, from Belmont, CA.

He was booked into San Francisco County Jail for the following charges: to carry a concealed firearm- 25400 (a)(1) PC, carries a concealed firearm on person- 25400(a)(2) PC, two counts of carrying a loaded firearm- 25850(a) PC, having a controlled substance while armed- 11370.1 HS, felon in possession of ammunition- 30305(a)(1) PC, possession of drug paraphernalia- 11364(a) HS, resisting arrest- 148(a)(1)

PC, running a stop sign- 22450(a) CVC, possession of sedatives without prescription- 11375(b)(2) HS, a vehicle shall only be driven only in direction designated- 21657 CVC, unsafe lane changes- 22107, and five active and outstanding warrants out of San Mateo County.

# MITCHELL HOYT CONVICTED OF FIRST-DEGREE BURGLARY

SAN FRANCISCO—On Friday, October 11, the San Francisco District Attorney's Office disclosed that a conviction was secured against Mitchell Hoyt, 34, after a trial by jury for breaking into an Upper Market Home and stealing an electric scooter while the residents were present. He was convicted of first-degree burglary (PC 459).

A press release from the SFDA's Office indicated, according to evidence and other testimony presented at trial, on March 15, Hoyt scaled a fence leading to the backyard of a residential building on the 3700 block of Market Street, in broad daylight, where the victims lived. He jumped into the backyard patio and walked towards the victims' garage on the first floor of the residence.

He entered the garage and stole a motorized scooter belonging to one of the residents before fleeing. The residents were all home as this transpired

and two of them tried to chase Hoyt who was on the scooter, but he got away. The entire incident was captured on surveillance video. On April 16, an officer with the San Francisco Police Department spotted the defendant in the Fisherman's Wharf area and arrested him.

"San Francisco residents deserve to feel secure in their homes and not have property stolen from them in broad daylight," said Assistant District Attorney Angela Roze. "I would like to thank the jury for their careful consideration of the evidence and the law in this case, holding Mr. Hoyt accountable for his actions."

Hoyt is currently in custody and his sentencing is scheduled for October 28.

# LUIS REBOLLEDO ARRESTED FOR MISSION DISTRICT HOMICIDE

SAN FRANCISCO—On October 16, the San Francisco Police Department disclosed that a suspect involved in a Mission District murder has been arrested.

The SFPD reported on July 24, at approximately 5:41 p.m., officers from Mission Station responded to 16th and Mission Streets regarding a shooting. Officers arrived on scene and located an adult male suffering from apparent gun-

shot wounds. Officers rendered aid and medics arrived on scene and transported the victim to the hospital for life-threatening injuries. Despite the lifesaving efforts of the emergency responders and medical staff, the victim died at the hospital. The name of the victim and age has not yet been disclosed to the public.

The SFPD Homicide Detail is leading the investigation. Investi-

gators developed probable cause to obtain arrest and search warrants regarding the murder.

On October 13, the SFPD Community Violence Reduction Team located and arrested Luis Rebolledo, 37, on the 600 block of Shaddick Dr. in Antioch. He was transported to San Francisco County Jail and was booked for his arrest warrant for the homicide (187(a) PC).

On October 15, the SFPD Com-

munity Violence Reduction Team located and arrested Giovanna Ramirez-Hernandez, 30, in San Francisco. She was booked for attempted extortion and other charges related to the case.
